Update on Council Projects **Cllr. Sarah Peacock** Chairman of Policy & Resources Committee

The unitary is on the horizon and we still await information on how that will affect us as a town/parish council. In the mean time we will continue to deliver our projects and prepare for additional responsibilities where possible.

We have the sports hub as a major project which is progressing and the results of recent trench diggings are being investigated by our agent. This will allow us to progress to the next stage of the project. Grants are continually being looked into to help support the various projects.

The Grounds Maintenance contract is also coming up for renewal and members and the clerk have been working on the new contract which will be going out for tender in the coming month. There is still a lot of work for the committee members to do and interviews will be taking place once a short list has been established.

The council is in the process of establishing working parties that will help to improve the High Street and a Businesses working party to help Rushden Town Council strengthen its working relationships with the larger businesses and help with the promotion and growth of the town with partners such as Rushden Lakes and the Town Partnership. These working parties will allow members to be involved in a similar way to their involvement in the Neighbourhood plan. As a town council we need to continue to be more business orientated and work towards making the town a place that is economically sound and stable. These are exciting but testing times, but with the District Council being made into a unitary we need to be ready to stand alone and have an established strategy for our town. We are one of the best amongst the larger parish councils in the County and we should be ready to grow with our already high standards.

This time in our Civic Year is also one when the budgets are set. Once again these decisions as always are ones taken very seriously and discussed thoroughly so that we provide the best we can for the town. We are a very proactive council and over the years the improvements to the town have been significant. Over the coming months, along with the day to day running of the council, we have new projects that we need to keep moving and with the full support of members and officers, we will continue in our role as a proactive and progressive council.

Thank you to the many volunteers who have made this event possible and will be helping on the day.



Rushden Town Council joins forces with Northamptonshire **Business Crime Partnership to** improve Rushden

Retailers throughout Rushden are being signed up to the latest information on prolific shoplifters following agreement from Rushden Town Council to fund membership for High Street retailers and many outlying stores to an intelligence gathering scheme.

Rushden Town Council has pledged to support retailers across the town to enrol with Northamptonshire Business Crime Partnership (NBCP), a non profit organisation aimed at clamping down on retail crime.

Northamptonshire Police and Crime Commissioner Stephen Mold supports NBCP, and he praised the actions of Rushden town council in ensuring that retailers in the town can access their services.

The Joint Action Group (JAG) has been set up for Rushden & Higham Ferrers Town Councils and meet on a quarterly basis to address crime and anti social behaviour with both towns where priorities are set.

The list of priorities for January-April 2019 are:

A. Drug issues in both Higham Ferrers and Rushden to be kept as a priority.

B. Anti social behaviour at Saffron Road Recreation Ground.

C. Anti social behaviour at all public toilets in Rushden.

The next meeting will be held on 9th April 2019.

40 Glorious Years of **Rushden Town Band**

Congratulations! This year, Rushden Town Band celebrates its 40th anniversary as well as promotion to Champion Section. The Band was originally formed in 1979 by Peter Kneale. Peter was conducting Rushden Windmill Band in the 1970s when he decided to form a 'B' Band with learners and young players. Its first conductor Peter Berrington, was a pupil of Peter Kneale.

The Band joined the contesting world in 1986 and were quickly rewarded by qualifying for the National Finals (4th Section). They became very busy performing concerts and competing all over the region. The Band was renamed Rushden Town Band in 1991 when it was offered practice facilities in the Town Band Club in Manton Road.

Its musical prowess grew and after a long succession of 2nd and 3rd places over many years, won its first contest in 1999, also performing for the first time in the Royal Parks in London ..

On 1 January 2006, Band members were devastated by the news that the Town Band Club had been destroyed by fire during the night. Along with their rehearsal facilities, many instruments, sets of music and uniforms were lost. The brass band world rallied around to help them out and they were offered rehearsal facilities at Rushden Working Men's Club, where they remain to this day.

Adele Hudson took over the baton in 2015 and has taken the Band from strength to strength.

Rushden Town Band represented the Midlands at the National Brass Band Championships (4th Section) in 2010 and 2011 and was promoted to the 3rd Section in 2012. The Band has steadily moved up the ranks year on year representing the Midlands at the National Brass Band Championships, finally gaining promotion to the Champion Section in January this year.



To reflect local pride in the Band's outstanding achievements, in 2017 Rushden Town Council presented the Band with banners for their music stands, something the Band had never had, and a grant via East Northants Council's Member Empowerment Fund allowed the Band to replace their 20-year-old uniforms. contact:- museum@rhts.co.uk

marks 2019 some important anniversaries for the railway that ran from Wellingborough through Rushden to Higham Ferrers. 60 years ago in June the last scheduled passenger train left Higham for Wellingborough. Rushden platform was full with spectators seeing the train leave and those travelling on the train when reaching Wellingborough realised they had to organise a way of getting home. 10 years later in November the last freight train left Higham to join the main line at Wellingborough.

More recently in 2009 Rushden Historical Transport Society re-opened a short length of the line from Rushden Station towards Higham Ferrers running heritage passenger trains. For a number of reasons no trains ran in 2018 but it is hoped that they can continue again this year.

To celebrate these anniversaries members of the Society are planning to put on an exhibition in the Museum Rooms in Rushden Station so are looking for photographs and recollections from travelling on the train from Rushden or Higham to Wellingborough.

New link road to improve access to Rushden Lakes

A new link road between Ditchford Lane and Rushden Lakes has been approved by East Northamptonshire Council's planning committee.

A new road will mean easy access to the popular retail and leisure park from the A45 east bound for those visiting the park and for those making deliveries. It would also include a shared pedestrian and cycle path alongside the road as well as safe crossing points for those on foot or bike.

Leader of East Northamptonshire Council, Steven North, said: "We have been working closely with the site owners and developers to get plans in for a road that will take the pressure off the main entrance to Rushden Lakes. We understand how essential the road is for the local area and highways and now that the application is approved, we look forward to receiving confirmation of when work will start."
