Update on Council Projects

Chairman of Policy & Resources Committee

The committee continues to monitor the day to day expenditure of the Council to ensure we remain within our annual budget parameters.

The committee has recently given Shop Front Grants to Elegance by Leah, Crystelle Belle Weddings & Speedy Repair. These grants are up to a maximum of £750 and help support local businesses and enhance the appeal of the High Street.

A Community Grant was also awarded to Rushden Hall Ladies to help them with future room hire for their meetings.

The provision of Defibrillators within the town, was also discussed and an article appears in this edition as to the way forward.

A report on the Local Government Reform (LGR) was also received, this helps to keep members up to date with the new Unitary progress. A prospectus for change is available on the Northamptonshire County Council website at Unitary Council – Local Government Reform

Cllr Martin Griffith (Wellingborough Borough Council) has been elected leader for the North Northamptonshire Unitary and will lead the way forward supported by the leaders of East Northamptonshire, Corby and Kettering Councils.

Rushden Town Council's responsibilities will remain unchanged, with its principle authority remaining the same for the time being. However, I am sure there will be some extra responsibilities heading our way once the Unitary process has been completed. As a Town Council we see this as a positive step as we can then make improvements to benefit the town.

As part of the Unitary process for North Northamptonshire there will be NEW town councils formed as the old Borough Councils disappear. This will most likely include Kettering and Wellingborough.

Rushden Town Council is always looking at ways to improve our amenities and environment and our ongoing list of projects is discussed at every meeting of this Committee. This list is updated regularly and some of the articles in this edition will give details of our current projects being progressed.

Work in Progress

• Speed Camera

The Town Council are looking to purchase a Vehicle Activated mobile speed camera that can be used in various locations through out the Town. We are at present compiling a list of suitable locations for the camera and therefore please contact us if you know of a location where excessive speeding regularly occurs. Spencer Park

We are at present updating some of the facilities within Spencer Park. The Tennis Courts and Multi Use Games Area are being revamped and we will be creating an enclosed Football Area on the redundant Tennis Court. This work has started and should be finished by early Autumn. At the request of Rushden resident Sharon Yates we have installed additional seating in Spencer Park. Ward member Councillor Peacock said she is delighted the town council were able to action Sharon's request and Spencer Ward residents will benefit from the additional seating and other improvements.

• Disabled Toilet in Hall Park

We have recently submitted a planning application to build a disabled toilet within Hall

Park. We are hoping, subject to planning we will be able to commence work on this project in October 2019. Once the new toilet has been completed we will then start the refurbishment of the existing toilets in Hall Park.

Defibrillators

The Town Council had agreed to put defibrillators into Hall Park, Spencer Park and Jubilee Park, however we have since been approached by several Community groups and Business groups who wish to make a financial contribution to the purchase of defibrillators. We are therefore now looking at additional locations throughout the town. We are aiming to create a list of all defibrillator sites within the town and hope to publish this once the new ones have been installed.



6th Green Flag Award

For a 6th successive year, Rushden Town Council has been awarded a Green Flag for Hall Park. The Green Flag Award® scheme recognises and rewards well managed parks and green spaces, setting the benchmark standard for the management of recreational outdoor spaces across the United Kingdom and around the world.

As the international standard for parks and green spaces, holding a Green Flag Award® brings with it a vast amount of prestige. It indicates an excellent example of civic achievement and should be a source of great pride to our community.

Thank you to all the staff involved in working so hard to ensure Hall Park continues to hold this prestigious award and for their work on all our open spaces throughout the year.



New Addition to Nature Trail

There will soon be an impressive addition to the nature trail in Hall Park. Our beautiful new Storytelling chair was recently on display at Party in the Park and, once installed, will provide a perfect focal point to our outdoor classroom area. Children love listening to stories and inventing their own. Storytelling helps them to develop their literacy skills through a love of stories and will stimulate their imaginations.

JAG Meeting Aug 2019

Irthlingborough Town Council requested that they be allowed to join Rushden and Higham Ferrers J.A.G. group. This was thought to be a good idea as we all work in close proximity with each other. Mrs Angie Daly, Irthlingborough Town Clerk and Cllr. Jon Gray were welcomed to our meeting on 16th July 2019.

A further location for CCTV within our towns was discussed, and evaluations would take place to ascertain where the new CCTV would have the most impact within the towns.

There have been good results regarding drug use and dealing from the police proactive team.

Anti-social behaviour continues to be a problem in our towns, parks and open public spaces.

We have previously been allowed three priorities, but this is to be reduced to one priority per town only. Therefore it was decided to ask the police to concentrate on all parks and open public spaces within Higham Ferrers, Rushden and Irthlingborough.

We were informed that Drug Dogs would be making a presence around all the local pubs.

An excess of graffiti had been reported and East Northamptonshire Council's Waste Management Department will be dealing with this.

NEW RECRUITMENT DRIVE

An ambition to recruit more than 200 police officers by 2021 has started with a major new recruitment campaign.

In April, Police Fire and Crime Commissioner Stephen Mold and Chief Constable Nick Adderley, announced the Force would be recruiting more than 200 new police officers over the next two years, taking the numbers above 1300 for the first time since 2010.

To increase applications and help bolster the ranks, the Force is using the strap line #FitTheBill alongside a recruitment campaign.

An inspirational video, available on the Force website and You Tube channel, is hoping to motivate and attract applications from a diverse background. Chief Constable Nick Adderley, said: "This job really is like no other. There are few careers that offer the variety of a police constable role. There are many diverse areas that police officers develop into, from detective to specialist dog handler, from cyber crime expert to financial crime investigator. The list is endless. How far an officer goes, is really up to them. One thing that is guaranteed, is that the role gives people a real opportunity to give back to the community and make a real difference to people's lives, while developing real life skills that will transform who they are."

An Open Meeting held at Pizzeria Venezia on 7 August by Rushden Town Partnership (RTP) was well attended by a broad mix of people including residents, local businesspeople, representatives of community groups and the local authority.

Not everyone was there just for the free pizza! The aim of the meeting was to set out the role RTP has to play but mainly to hear the views of those also passionate about keeping the town at the heart of our community.

From the questions raised, access to spaces in public car parks was a major concern. To help answer some of the questions, consideration would be given to holding surveys to establish whether visitors to Rushden Lakes also come into the town to shop but also whether spaces were being taken up by staff/visitors going to Rushden Lakes who park in the public car parks and catch a bus to Rushden Lakes.

There were many more questions to be asked but time ran out. RTP therefore plan to hold another Open meeting in the near future.
